

ADULT SUNDAY SCHOOL CLASSES

Fall 2019

PATHWAYS-

Lower Level Room 102

We are located on the lower level of the education building, on the right side, right before you cross into the new section of the church.

The Pathways class is made up of mostly young adults between the ages of 18 and 40. We are a very laid back class, everyone shares and speaks in a seminar format, and we usually average around 10 people on a Sunday morning. In the Fall semester, we will continue studying different prophets of the Bible.

DISCIPLES CLASS-

Lower Level Room 134

The class is located on the bottom floor between the two buildings on the right.

The Disciples class is made up of people from all different ages and stages in their lives. We have members as young as 17 and as old as – well, older than we like to count. We also have couples, singles and complete families. This class uses a variety of scripturally based Bible studies ranging from DVD, book, and small group discussions. In the fall we will be using Right Now Media and their Bible Studies which include “The Gospel of Jonah” by Eric Mason and “The Book of Mark” by Francis Chan. You can find us any Sunday morning enjoying coffee and fellowship. Class time begins at 9:45 a.m. but if you are running late, please feel free to still come on in. The class is very mission oriented and participates in various monthly missions as well as impromptu situations that need to be addressed. The longest running mission is our food ministry that delivers food to families in nearby areas once a month. We enjoy collaborative events with other classes such as the annual Shrove Tuesday Pancake Supper. We have been blessed for the past 5 years to participate at Christmas with the Operation North State Box packing. This outreach is specific to North Carolina soldiers stationed overseas or in the reserves. We also support the mission work of Jeremy and Melissa Reese in Spain with One Mission Society and the students at Hoof and Paw therapeutic riding center.

COVENANT CLASS-

Upper Level Room 202

Second Floor of the education building, last class on the left before the new kitchen and Family Life Center hall.

The Covenant Class is made up of members from ages 50 to 70 plus years old. We enjoy good fellowship and caring about each other. We use the David C. Cook literature as our lesson study guide. We have three or four socials each year. We have an oyster stew in February, in the summer we have a hotdog supper and at Christmas we have heavy finger foods with games and fellowship. Our mission is to serve our Lord Jesus Christ and to help others that are in need of financial assistance or just an encouraging word.



WILLING WORKERS BIBLE CLASS-

Upper Level Room 201

Our class is located across from the parlor through the double doors of the education building at the Fellowship Hall.

We have a great number of members ranging from ages in the late 30's to ninety one! We love to visit before class starts, but we start promptly at 9:45. Some of us even come early (9:00 a.m.) so that we can visit and talk and enjoy the band music. We always stand when the band plays the *Star Spangled Banner*.

We love to sing, love to discuss the lessons, (we use the David C. Cook quarterly) and we have 2 dinners; a post-Christmas dinner in January and a June get together at the home of Travis and Evva Hanes. We have a wonderful, loving, caring, class that loves to study and discuss God's Word together.

DISCOVERY CLASS-

Lower Level Room 108

We are located on the ground floor of the education building at the bottom of the stairs across from the new elevator.

The Discovery Class is made up of both couples and singles of all ages. Whether in your 30s or approaching 90, you are welcome to come, bring your Bible and grow along with us. We currently have approximately 40 members enrolled in the class and Ed Steward is the teacher. We study the Bible one book at a time, verse by verse. Class members vote on what book they want to study. For the rest of this year, this class will take a deeper look at Ruth and Jonah. The format includes reading scripture, lecture and discussion. No quarterly is used. The Discovery Class hosts the Poor Man's Lunch in February as our main fund raiser. We have an annual Christmas party in December. Throughout the year we help with various activities in the life of the church.

FELLOWSHIP CLASS-

Lower Level Room 103

We are located upstairs in the education building between the bathrooms and the nursery.

Class members range in age from 30- 65 and we have about 15-20 regular attendees. Our mission is to teach and share the word of Jesus. We sponsor the Shrove Tuesday pancake supper every year, we sell chicken pies all year long, we serve food at the Youth Bazaar every year and any other fund-raisers we can get involved in. We volunteer for Touching Davidson County with Love, we do community projects regularly, and we adopt families at Christmas and during the year as well. Our mission is to help in the community as much as we can and therefore to raise the money to do all we can. We do some Bible studies and enjoy variety in our curriculum. Currently, we continue our study of the curriculum called The Gospel Project.
